## PRIVATE SECURITY INDUSTRY REGULATION ACT 56 OF 2001

*(Gazette No. 23051, Notice No. 77, dated 25 January 2002. Commencement date: 14 February 2002 [Proc. R10, Gazette No. 23120, dated 14 February 2002].)*

### EXEMPTION IN TERMS OF SECTION 1(2) AND 20(5) OF THE ACT

*General Notice 20 in Government Gazette 42971 dated 24 January 2020. Commencement date: 24 January 2020.*

By virtue of the power vested in the Minister of Police by sections 1(2) and 20(5) of the Private Security Industry Regulation Act, 2001 (Act No. 56 of 2001). I, Bheki Hailton Cele, hereby determine that Association of Fraud Examiners South Africa (ACFESA) are exempted from the provisions of section 20(1)(a) of the Private Security Industry Regulation Act, 2001 (Act No. 56 of 2001), for a period of five years from the date hereof, on condition that –

- ACFESA provide PSIRA with the list of all their members who wish to be exempted from application of the PSIR Act;
- ACFESA must ensure that such list contain all its members who have been criminally vetted against the records of the Criminal Records Centre and are also compliant with the registration requirements of section 23 of the PSIR Act;
- The exemption will only be in respect of section 23(1)(i) which deals with requirements of payment of the application fee, the requirements of section 23(1)(a) up to (h) including (j) and the rest of the section will remain applicable;
- ACFESA is further exempted from the requirements of annual fees, in terms of section 32 of the Security Officers Act 1987 and section 44(7) of the PSIR Act;
- This waiver will automatically fall away when the levies Act comes into operation; and
- That each member of CFESA whose application for exemption has been approved will appear on PSIRA's database as prescribed in terms of section 24.
